In January we welcomed Education & Social Services students Nimra & Aiden from Glasgow Clyde College. They spent four weeks placement with us here at the South learning about our organisation and the work we do. They also spent time getting to know our volunteers. They chatted and listened to them as they spoke about their life struggles with addiction, hurdles they have faced in life and how they found recovery support within our community.

Aiden kindly shared a few words with us regarding his experience.

"Recently I had a placement at South Community Recovery Network (SCRN). I had a great learning experience during my time there. It was a very friendly environment. The staff and the volunteers made me feel at home right away, but I seen that everyone was treated that way when they came through the doors at SCRN on a day-to-day basis as they treated everyone with respect. All the staff and volunteers were very approachable and were always willing to talk to me about their past experiences, which I can't thank them enough for, I understand that sometimes it can't be easy talking about the past. The staff and volunteers have great relationships with the service users and would do anything they can to help them on their recovery journeys. I feel SCRN is a good well-run service that service users benefit from. It has helped people change their lives around, the staff and volunteers are proof of that. Personally, it was nice to see service users coming in with a real lack of confidence not wanting to talk to anyone and within a few weeks you could see a massive difference in people from just having a community of good people round them that is supportive. I loved my time at SCRN and couldn't have had a better placement".

Both Nimra and Aiden were a pleasure to have with us and we wish them well in their studies and future careers.

<u>Lilias Centre Focus Group</u>



The Lilias Centre is a Community Custodial Unit (CCU) for women located in the Maryhill area of Glasgow. The aim is to support the needs of women who would benefit from closer community contact and access to local services.

Anna (Outreach Worker) and Helen (Recovery Senior) visited the centre for a chat with the women currently in custody. They held a focus group and asked the ladies what kind of support they feel they would benefit from and what visions they have for the future. The ladies spoke openly with Anna & Helen and enjoyed chatting to them over a cuppa.

Helen returned to the centre for International Women's Day and came back with lots of feedback and ideas regarding the type of help and support the ladies feel would be beneficial for them in order to progress with their own personal development.

Discussions are still in the early stages however we hope to visit the centre more this year in order to provide peer recovery support and access to other recovery initiatives available within the community.


